PACE (Program for Accelerated College Enrollment)

Eligible high school juniors and seniors can satisfy high school graduation requirements and earn college credit at the same time, getting an early start on a college degree saving time and money. High School students may earn college/university credit as PACE students through online courses, through requested courses taught on the high school campus, or through courses taught on an HGTC campus. Many PACE university/college courses are transferable to all South Carolina two- and four-year colleges and universities, as well as many private and out of state colleges. Students are encouraged to contact the college which they intend to attend to confirm course transferability and be advised concerning appropriate course selections for their major.

HCS Dual Enrollment Guidelines and Dual-Credit Course Cost

- **Minimize the course load during the college freshman and sophomore years**, improving the student's ability to meet and maintain the "B" average required to keep scholarships such as LIFE; and
- **Help to smooth the transition from high school** to the academic demands of college.

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Lottery Tuition Assistance for PACE

SC resident students receive Lottery Tuition Assistance (LTA) when enrolled in two PACE courses (6 cr. hrs.) in one semester, paying over half of tuition costs for 6 credit hours.

TAP (Technical Advanced Placement)

Students interested in careers in technology and business can maximize their opportunities through TAP, the Technical Advanced Placement program. TAP is designed to provide exemption credit to HGTC for specific courses taken while still in high school. Interested students should contact their high school guidance counselor or CATE teacher.

Technical Scholars Program

Technical Scholars Welding Program at HGTC is a dual enrollment opportunity designed for high school seniors who are interested in welding related occupations. The program offers students an opportunity to participate in dual enrollment courses earning both high school and college credits during the fall and spring semesters reducing overall college costs significantly. Students can continue for the summer session to fulfill the necessary HGTC program requirements for completion of the Welding major assisting students with job placement opportunities. However, the summer session is not dual enrollment due to it taking place after graduation from high school. During the three-semester program students will have be exposed to skill training needed to earn welding certification from the industry. Students are to contact their guidance counselor for more information on the Technical Scholars program and obtain a Technical Scholars Application Packet.
