The Myrtle Beach Seahawks have a tradition of academic and athletic excellence with numerous state titles in multiple sports and tremendous support from the community and proud alumni. Myrtle Beach takes pride in offering tremendous opportunities in the fine and performing arts for students wishing to experience and express themselves through music, theatre, and visual arts.

Myrtle Beach High School is in the fifth year of its partnership with The New Tech Network (<http://www.newtechnetwork.org/>) to offer a project-based learning environment to students in a school-within-a-school called Seahawk New Tech. This innovative approach offers integrated core classes that utilize technology and project/problem based learning to help students explore and expand their knowledge.

Students collaborate on meaningful projects that require critical thinking, creativity, and communication in order for them to answer challenging questions or solve complex problems.

College prep and honors level courses are available to students in Seahawk New Tech for grades 9-12. This unique concept will offer your student the opportunity to develop critical thinking skills within a rigorous curriculum that will ensure they are college and career ready as well as appropriately skilled to compete in the 21st century marketplace.

Myrtle Beach High School students may also elect to participate in the MBHS AP Academy where students have the opportunity to enroll in Advance Placement (AP) courses; which include, AP Literature, AP Language, AP Human Geography, AP US History, AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Statistics, AP Government, AP Microeconomics, AP Macroeconomics, AP Physics, AP Psychology, AP Music Theory, AP Art 2-D, and AP Spanish. The MBHS AP Scholar program offers students a 4-year plan where they have the opportunity to complete up to 16 Advanced Placement courses and to qualify for the Advanced Placement International Diploma the College Board. MBHS also offers many and Technical Education (CATE) courses: such Health Science Technology, Business Administration, Marketing, Accounting, Sports Medicine, Mechanical Drawing, Architectural Drawing, Desktop Publishing, and Computer Science.

We also encourage students to join extracurricular clubs such as FBLA, Key Club, Mock Trial, Student Government, HOSA, Ground Zero, FCA, National Art Honors Society, and Academic Team. Other clubs include those of excellence and achievement such as National Honor Society, Beta Club, and Mu Alpha Theta, and Rho Kappa.

Entrance Requirements

Students wishing to participate in the **Seahawk New Tech or the MBHS AP Academy** will need to submit an application. Parents may pick up an application from the Myrtle Beach High School Guidance Department or the main office. They may also access applications online at mbh.horrycountyschoolst.net.
