National Stop the Bleed Day Scholarships:

Are you a high school student? You can help yourself and help your school by making a 1 to 2 minute video or writing an essay from 250 to 500 words to tell us about why Stop the Bleed is important to you, to your school and to your community. Winning students will receive scholarship money towards post secondary education provided by the Stop the Bleeding Coalition. The schools that winning students attend will receive free Stop the Bleed Kits.

First Place:

\$3000 Scholarship awarded to the student
30 Stop the Bleed Kits to the student's high school

Second Place:

\$1500 Scholarship awarded to the student
15 Stop the Bleed Kits to the student's high school

Third Place:

\$500 Scholarship awarded to the student
5 Stop the Bleed Kits to the student's high school

Submissions must be received by theteam@nationalstopthebleeday.org no later than 5/9/19. All submissions should include the following:

Essay or Video; student name and grade; school name and address; name, title, and email for one school point of contact (teacher, school nurse, guidance counselor or principal).

Essays should be sent as a Word or Google doc. Videos should be posted to YouTube and the link included in the submission.

Winners will be announced on National Stop the Bleed Day. Winners and their schools will be notified immediately after National Stop the Bleed Day to coordinate scholarship funding and for the schools to receive the Stop the Bleed Kits and Training.

Blanton Family Scholarship Guidelines and Application

The Blanton Family Scholarship Committee will award a \$500.00 college scholarship to two well-rounded seniors at Green Sea Floyds High School that have demonstrated good character, scholastic achievement, participation in extracurricular school and community activities, and have a financial need.

The following requirements must be met in order to be awarded one of the two scholarships:

1. The recipients must be seniors at Green Sea Floyds High School.
2. The recipients must be students in good standing academically by achieving at least a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
3. The recipients must be involved in extracurricular and community activities. Applicants must provide a listing of the activities on the application.
4. The recipients must be accepted into and enroll in an accredited two year or four year college.
5. The recipients must provide an essay answering the following questions:
How have you demonstrated leadership ability both in and out of school?
Why are you a good candidate to receive this award?
From a financial standpoint, what impact would this scholarship have on your education? State any special personal or family circumstances affecting your need for financial assistance.
6. Please provide two reference letters – one being from an educational entity (teacher, guidance counselor, principal, etc.) and one being from a community leader/employer (pastor, youth group leader, well respected community member, advisory board member, etc.) and attach them to the application.
7. The recipients have fully completed the application and returned it to the guidance office by the deadline date.

Note: If more space is needed on the application or you have all required information on a resume or activities sheet, please attach the document to the application along with your essay and reference letters. (Please make sure the application is legible or type all of the information and attach it to the application.)

Terms and Conditions

☑ Two \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to rising college freshmen attending either Coastal Carolina University or Francis Marion University for a four-year degree. The scholarship may be renewed for an additional three years in the amount of \$500 per year should the award recipient continue to meet qualifying criteria. The criteria include maintaining a 3.0 GPA and a full-time semester schedule of at least 12 hours at either Coastal Carolina University or Francis Marion University. The total amount a Key Scholarship recipient may be awarded over a four-year period is \$2,500.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be a graduating high school senior.
- Have at least a 3.0 GPA.
- Be accepted by and plan to attend either Coastal Carolina University (CCU) or Francis Marion University (FMU) for at least four years.
- Be enrolled in a minimum of 12 college credit hours (full-time status) at either CCU or FMU.

Francis Marion University Scholarships-

The James F. Konduros Scholarship

The Konduros Scholarship awards \$6,000 for tuition and other expenses and, when combined with other state scholarships, it can cover a year's tuition. Selection is based on applications and interviews. Konduros Scholars are accepted into FMU Honors and Leadership FMU.

The Education Fellow Scholarship

The \$5,000 scholarship can be awarded to prospective Education majors who are part of the South Carolina Teacher Cadet Program. Preference is given to FMU-sponsored Teacher Cadets.

Francis Marion University Fellows Scholars
Fellows receive annual awards of between \$1,500-\$2,500.
Scholarship awards are based on applications and interviews.

Distinction Scholarship
All students who enroll at FMU, and who meet the minimum criteria for University scholarships, will receive an annual Distinction Scholarship award of \$1,000. If a student is awarded another University scholarship, it will replace the Distinction Scholarship and will not be awarded in addition to it.

Donor-Supported Scholarships
Donors and supporters of Francis Marion University provide funds for more than 150 named, specialty scholarships at FMU. These scholarships are available to all students, although many have specialized qualifying criteria, such as a particular field of study or specific hometown or home county. Awards vary, as do specific qualifications. For more information, visit:

Dates and Process
Scholarship applications for University-awarded Scholarships, excluding the McNair Scholarship, are due by March 15. Awards will be made during the spring, following on-campus interviews. Distinction Scholarships will be awarded automatically after admission

Recovery Scholarship ESSAY:

- To enter to win a \$1,000 scholarship, simply submit a short essay (no more than 500 words) describing why you are passionate about substance use disorder and mental health treatment. Essays can be in the form of a personal narrative with a medical perspective or focus specifically on clinical experience.
- Do you have a compelling recovery story? Have you witnessed the challenges that addiction can present, or helped someone overcome substance use disorder? Share your experience and describe why you are eager to enter the health care field for a chance to be awarded a \$1,000 scholarship.
