Our Mission Statement: The mission of Myrtle Beach High School, a diverse community of students, parents, and faculty within a constantly changing resort area, is to ensure that each student has the maximum opportunity to develop as a lifelong learner and contributing citizen in a global society through personalized and innovative educational experiences.

Diploma Requirements and Academic Program:

- The school year is designed around a two-term program. Students may select a variety of more than 100 different courses in ten disciplines. Students are required to be enrolled in up to (8) unit courses each year. Most of the high school schedule is divided into four 90 minutes blocks meeting every day for one term. Curriculum levels are available in all core areas.
- A total of 17 advanced placement, and more than 40 honors classes, are also offered at MBHS. College and high school credits are available through the Program for Accelerated College Enrollment (PACE) at Horry Georgetown Technical College and from Coastal Carolina University. Extended studies in ten career majors are available from the Academy for Technology and Academics and the Academy for the Arts, Science, and Technology.

Minimum Graduation Requirements:

- English: 4 Units
- Math: 4 Units
- Social Studies: 3 Units, including US History, Gov't/Econ, and one Social Studies elective
- Science: 3 Units for High School Graduation and 3 Lab sciences for college.
- PE and/or JROTC: 1 Unit
- Computer Studies: 1 Unit
- CATE (Career and Technical Education) or Foreign Language 1 Unit (2-4 units Foreign Language for a (4 year college)
- Electives: 7 Units

Note: Students must earn a total of at least 24 Carnegie units. Grading Scale A= 90-100 B=80-89
C=70-79 D=60-69 F=0-59
