I hope this communication finds you well. Schools are closed on Monday, January 15 and Tuesday, January 16. Students start a new semester on Wednesday! Please read below for important updates and reminders.

Important Tiger Links

In an effort to streamline *The Weekly ROAR* and minimize the number of pages shared, many important links have been added to the first page of this document. Please be sure to review this page for quick access to important items!

<u>Affirmations</u>

An affirmation plays an important role in our thought process. Affirmations are great for motivation, inspiration, and self-talk to help us reach our full potential. Each week a new affirmation will be shared with students. This week's affirmation is below.

<u>Attendance</u>

Students are allowed 3 unexcused absences in a quarter course, 5 in a semester course, and 10 in a yearlong course. The HCS Attendance Policy outlines procedures for truancy and promotion retention. Please find the HCS Attendance Policy here. Regarding truancy, a student between the ages of 6-17 who misses 3 unexcused consecutive days or 5 unexcused total days within a school year is deemed truant and will be placed on an Attendance Intervention Plan (AIP). Regarding promotion retention, students may not miss over 3 unexcused or unverified class periods in a quarter course, over 5 unexcused or unverified



class periods in a semester course, or over 10 total unexcused or unverified class periods in a yearlong course in order to receive credit for the course. The unexcused codes are *SC-UNEX*, *SC-UEPN*, and *SC-UEDM*. Please check PowerSchool consistently to monitor attendance.

To recover seat time, students may attend Tiger Extension, our after-school tutorial program. To recover 1 block (90 minutes), students are required to stay for 1 hour. The tutoring schedule can be found here. Also, students may attend Saturday tutorial sessions. The sessions are held from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. They should bring assignments to receive assistance. The Saturday dates are below. The last day to make up attendance for Semester 1 is February 24. Students must attend summer attendance school to recover time for Semester 1 after February 24.

Principal-Approved Absences: Successful completion of high school courses results in the issuance of Carnegie units needed for a high school diploma. Since our high schools and program schools operate on a 4 x 4 block schedule, it is crucial that students miss as few days as possible. **Based on this information, it is not feasible for our secondary schools and program schools to grant principal-approved days effective this year.** Religious-based camps, retreats, trips, and conferences are not excused. Absences due to major religious holidays are excused. Please send notes to the attendance office regarding absences for religious holidays.

Job Shadowing

Job Shadowing will be held on Friday, February 23. This event is for juniors and seniors only. Students must seek an employer who allows students to shadow for an entire day. Employers must agree to complete paperwork as it relates to student observations, and the career/place of business must align with the student's career choice as outlined in their Individual Graduation Plan. After Monday, January 29, students may pick up an application from outside Mrs. Schofield's door. Her room number is A217. All applications are due on Wednesday, February 14.

Media Center

This is a reminder that the media center is open before school from 7:45 a.m. to 8:05 a.m. and during lunches. Students may visit during these times with a pass from a teacher or administrator.

Also, students will have the opportunity to earn Tiger Bucks for being Ready, Organized, Accountable, and Respectful, allowing them discounts to the a la carte line during lunches and the school store. Also, students who are given Tiger Bucks will gain **free entry** to athletic events. Students were informed about this during advisory.

Safety

All visitors must report to the main office. Please discuss the importance of school safety with your students. The guidelines below should be adhered to at all times:

- Along with the district, we have adopted the "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol. The standard response protocol utilizes clear common language for emergency situations. It is important that students and staff familiarize themselves with this protocol. Our standard response protocol can be found here in English and here in Spanish. This information was previously emailed by Mr. DiMeglio, our safety coordinator.
- Students are not to open exterior doors for visitors.



- Students should never prop open an exterior door with objects or intentionally leave an exterior door ajar. Exterior doors should be pulled closed and locked at all times, except during transition.
- All safety drills are to be taken seriously. Students should conduct themselves orderly and take direction from staff members.
- If students see or hear something concerning, they should report this information to a staff member immediately. Safety is a priority.


