Online Registration will open May 15 and students may begin recording June 17.

This year's program is interactive and online. There's a reading contest for everyone—babies, kids, teens and adults. Signing up is free and easy. **Register** to get started. **Login** as often as possible to keep track of the books you are reading.

Your last day to log books will be August 31!

Parents: If you would like to create a Family Account, please register yourself first and then register your children under your account.

What if we do not have access to the internet? No problem. The public library or your school library will have a paper chart that you can track your progress.

HORRY COUNTY LIBRARY INCENTIVES:

Prizes will be given for reading: 5 books, 10 books, 15 books or 20 books. Stop by the HCML for a list of specific prizes rewarded by their library.

Rising 1st & 2nd Grade Students

Prizes will be given for reading *at least 20 books this summer (chapter books, Achieve articles, picture books, biographies, nonfiction, magazines, graphic novels, eBooks, etc)* and recording them online through the HCML or on the paper chart.

Rising 3rd, 4th & 5th Grade Students

Prizes will be given for reading *at least 20 books this summer (chapter books, Achieve articles, picture books, biographies, nonfiction, magazines, graphic novels, eBooks, etc.)* **AND** completing **1 of the activities below for 2 of the books** from your reading list.

Reading Activities

- Create a book trailer telling about one of the books from your list (do not tell the ending). Encourage other students to read the book.
- Write a letter to Mrs. Beverly telling her about a book from your list.
- Pick a favorite character from two different books and write a new story or play in which they meet.
- Write a song, rap or poem about one of the books from your list. You may turn the song in on paper or record yourself performing the piece.
- Create a collage that tells about one of the books from your list.
- Create a comic book that tells the story of one of the books from your list.
- Write a summary of one of the books from your list.
- Design a poster telling about one of the books from your list.

CES will get a report from the Horry County Memorial Library of your participation as of August 31. You must have at least 20 books recorded for this reward.

If you completed a paper copy of the chart, this chart should be turned into Mrs. Beverly no later than Tuesday, September 3.

How it Works:

- Register for an account.
- Log into your account and record your reading.
- For more details, click on the tab for your program.

Put reading first, every day throughout the summer:

1. Sign up the whole family for the Summer Reading Program offered by your local public library.
2. Visit your local library again and again this summer. Ask your librarian for suggestions of great books to read yourself or to your young child. Once you register you will also have access to exciting, age appropriate, reading lists made available by the librarians.
3. **Set a goal of reading AT LEAST 15 minutes every day.** For very young children and struggling readers, that can be spread out through the day.
4. Log your books online or on the paper chart.
5. Make reading fun all summer long!

Frequently Asked Questions

Who can participate?

Babies, toddlers, preschoolers, children, teens, adults — everyone! Children too young to read by themselves are welcome to participate by having a parent or caretaker sign them up and read to them.

Can I count books that I read on my computer or e-reader?

Of course! It's all the same to us.

Can I count books that I read to my kids?

For sure! We love when you read to your kids!

Can I count audiobooks?

You bet!

Can I join the program after its official start date?

You bet! And if you can remember any reading that you've done after the official start date, you're welcome to go back and count that.

Can I count reading that I've done before the official start date?

Actually no, we do ask that you count **ONLY** the reading you've done within the official dates of the program.

Will Achieve 3000 articles count as reading?

You bet!
