### ATTENDANCE POLICY & REMINDERS

South Carolina State Policy: To receive credit for a course toward graduation requirements, high school students must pass the course with a minimum of 60 and must meet the required seat time guidelines as set by the State of South Carolina. Failures due to attendance or FA's will be counted each semester of the 23-24 school year. If you have questions about your attendance, please see an administrator.

#### **Failure Due to Attendance Guidelines**


**Semester Courses:** Any student over 5 unexcused absences (UNEX, UEPN) per class at the end of each semester will fail due to attendance.

**Quarter Classes** (Government/Economics): Any student over 2 unexcused absences (UNEX, UEPN) per class at the end of each quarter will fail due to attendance.

An FA results in a student not receiving credit regardless of a passing grade.

#### **Attendance Recovery Opportunities**

- Students may stay after school Monday-Thursday from 2:45-4:15 to make up attendance. Sign up with Dr. Pridgen.
- Students may stay after school Monday-Thursday from 2:45-3:30 to make up attendance during tutoring. Students will need to make sure to let the teacher know they are staying for tutoring/attendance recovery.
- Students will need to make sure they have a ride home no later than 4:30 pm as transportation is not provided.
- Students may make up attendance at their base high school if approved by the base school principal and Dr. Pridgen. See Dr. Pridgen for base school opportunities.
- Virtual opportunities are limited and must be approved by Dr. Pridgen.
