

Scholars Academy Alumni—Where Are They Now?

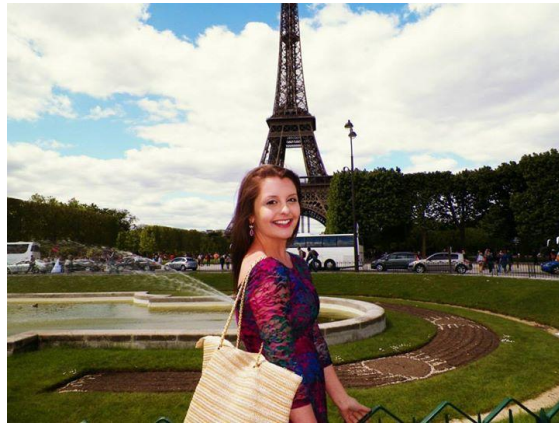

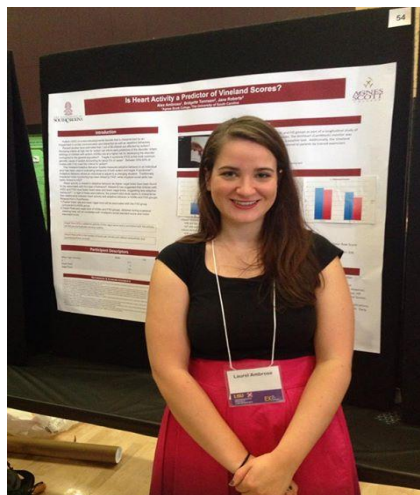

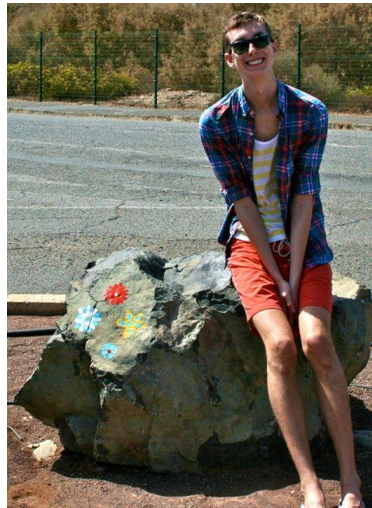
