Follow these simple steps to participate in the Superintendent's Reading Honor Roll:

- Ask your teacher or library media specialist how many books are required for your grade level.
- Ask a parent to read this letter and approve your participation in the program.
- Select a book you want to read. If you need help selecting a book, ask your library media specialist for assistance.
- Record the book title on the reading log and have a parent or teacher sign the log to verify that you have read the book.
- After finishing one book, select the next and follow the same steps outlined above.
- After you have read your required number of books, turn in the completed reading log to your teacher or library media specialist.
- Your Superintendent's Reading Honor Roll certificate will be sent to you in May.

I hope you choose to complete this challenge. I want to share with you the value and power of good books, as the pleasure of reading lasts a lifetime.
